## Top changes for allied health professionals when electronic health records (EHR) are fully activated at their site\*:

1. Receive consults and manage your case load electronically (Multi Patient Task List)
2. View physician/team orders electronically in the EHR.
3. Place orders within your role and scope to inform patient care.
4. This may include contributing to Interdisciplinary Plans of Care (IPOCS)
5. Continue to view completed paper forms via a small paper chart (called a chartlet) that will hold items such as signed consents, exercise handouts not yet built into Cerner Powerchart, etc
6. View clinic appointments via Ambulatory Organizer (\*For activated clinic areas using Cerner Scheduling)
7. Use MAR Summary to review medication administration and information

*\*More comprehensive workflow changes, based on specific roles and/or specialties, will be covered in engagement and training activities.*



### Consult vs Referral Orders in the EHR:

- Consult orders are placed for Inpatient professional services
- Referral Orders are used for Outpatient/ Clinic Requests.

Your Additional Treatment Tasks will now link directly to your Progress Note / Daily Documentation charting (No need to go to ADHOC for these PowerForms)

### Note regarding nutrition orders:

- Parenteral Nutrition (PN) ordering will be completely done in the EHR.
- Diet and nutrition related orders will be placed in the EHR. Orders will print out a requisition to communicate with the Diet Office once placed.
